## In the News...



### 2010 Young Professionals Award Winners

The Young Professionals Awards were created by the Greater Watertown Jaycees in 2007 to recognize our area leaders under the age of 40.

The Greater Watertown Jaycees, in partnership with the Jefferson-Lewis Workforce Investment Board and the Jefferson County Job Development Corporation, are pleased to announce the recipients of the 2010 Young Professionals Awards. This year's recipients are Jamie Mayer, Jennifer Hodge and Katie Taylor.

Jamie Mayer, founder of CNY Media Group, was selected for his outstanding leadership in business. Mr. Mayer started CNY Media Group, formerly known as Infinite Media, 10 years ago and has grown it into a very successful business. Mr. Mayer has served as a past president of the Downtown (Watertown) Business Association, and has organized the Taste of New York event for the past 6 years. This event is held annually in Sackett Harbor and highlights food and wines produced in the North Country and New York State with a portion of the event proceeds benefits a local charity.

Katie Taylor, music educator, Alexandria Central School, was selected for her outstanding leadership in arts and culture. Ms. Taylor is a graduate of the SUNY Potsdam Crane School of Music and is a vocal music educator for grades K-12 at Alexandria Central School. Ms. Taylor loves music and performs in the quartet, U4X, which won the 2008 International Championship. She also serves as the director of the Northern Blend Chorus, as the youth music coordinator for Harmony Incorporated, is a member of the Music Education National Conference, the Jefferson-Lewis County Music Teachers Association, and the North Country Arts Council.

Jennifer Hodge, Director of Development, North Country Children's Clinic, was selected for her outstanding leadership and volunteer work in her community. Ms. Hodge is actively involved in her community not only through her work at the Children's Clinic, but in organizations that she assists. She helped to organize a project in the South Jefferson School District that will send backpacks with food in them home to children in need, and helped the 2009 class of the Jefferson Leadership Institute organize a food drive. Ms. Hodge belongs to the Planned Giving Council, the Watertown Evening Club, and the Greater Watertown Jaycees. She also serves on the board of directors for WPBS.



## 2010 Board Position Descriptions

### **President - Leslie O'Hara**

The role of a Chapter President is to serve as the chief executive officer of the local organization, handling administrative and personnel management and implementing the directives of the Board of Directors. As the leader of the local organization, he or she also serves as a member of the state organization Board of Directors, and the regional and district Boards, representing the views of the chapter. The President should preside over Board meetings, guiding the discussion on chapter business and the well-being of the membership. Membership meeting agendas are prepared at this time, so officers will know what is to happen and what will be expected of them.

### **Community & Networking Vice President - Erika Flint**

The Community Vice President directs recruitment (internal and external) activities of the chapter. Works with the Individual Development VP to select community projects that are of interest to the group. Gets to know members and their needs, and constantly promote the chapter and member's image in the community. Develops and coordinates our marquee event, Emerge NNY, and provides support for community outreach projects. Also, responsible for planning/executing monthly networking mixers, some formal and informal. Mixers must be planned in advance time for proper promotion. Helps to plan the annual YP Days and Emerge of each year. Must work closely with the other Board members for the promotion of these events. Works closely with each Vice President to promote all chapter projects.

### **Individual Development VP - AmberLee Clement**

Work with the Community Vice President to make sure members are prepared to conduct community-focused projects, and helps to coordinate Professional Development opportunities for members. Get to know members and their needs, and constantly promote the chapter and member's image in the community. The Individual Development Vice President should ensure that members are trained in such a manner to conduct effective programming in all areas. The IDVP also collaborates with the President and Community Vice Presidents to include their projects and programs in the promotion of member activation.

### **Membership VP & Secretary - Krista Capone**

The Membership VP ensures that membership records are kept for the chapter, including new membership applications, renewals, and lapsed memberships. Sends out renewal notices to members and all dues billing. Actively seeks out new members, by presenting to local companies, send out mailings, and other techniques. Maintains the relationship between current and past members with the Board and is a liaison between local chapter and state for membership rooster and dues. The Secretary takes care of all written documents of chapter activities, keeping them in an accurate manner, including meeting minutes, agendas, newsletters, and correspondence. The Secretary works with all Board members in an effort to provide important chapter information to members.

### **Treasurer - Michelle Capone**

The Treasurer ensures that all financial records are kept for the chapter. The Treasurer is responsible for filing appropriate paperwork in a timely manner, according to federal, state, and local laws and ensures the fiscal stability of the chapter by reviewing the bank statement and monies paid out monthly. The Treasurer communicates regularly with the Chapter President, and also reports to the Board and membership on the financial status. In this capacity, the Treasurer works with the Vice Presidents to ensure that they are provided with the information they need for projects and forecasting purposes.

### **Members-at-Large (2-3 positions available) - Tracy Leonard; Kristina Barker; Taylour Lynn Scanlin**

This Board position represents our general membership as a whole; helping to direct the Board and its actions and to become more involved in the decision-making on behalf of the group. These Board members also help support other Board Members and committee work.

The preceding year's President will stay on the Board for consistency purposes and to help new Board Members with their roles.
